OBJECTION AND REQUEST FOR HEARING

COME NOW Objectors, by and through undersigned counsel, and, pursuant to 820 ILCS 130/9 ("Section 9"), file this Objection and Request for Hearing to the prevailing wage determination posted by the Conciliation and Mediation Division for the Carpenter (Building) occupational title in Saline County on or about August 15, 2018, and state as follows:

- 1. As part of the wage survey process, on June 21, 2018, Objectors completed the online union survey form and submitted to the Division the collective bargaining agreement and wage sheet that were in effect in Saline County effective as of June 1, 2018 for the Carpenter (Building) occupational title.
- 2. The documents submitted by Objectors establish that the prevailing wage rate for the Carpenter (Building) occupational title in Saline County should be as follows: a base hourly wage rate of \$36.11; a foreman hourly prevailing wage rate of \$37.61; an hourly health insurance fringe benefit contribution of \$7.25; an hourly retirement fringe benefit contribution of \$9.25; an hourly vacation fringe benefit contribution of \$0.00; an hourly apprenticeship training fringe benefit contribution of \$0.50; and other fringes of \$0.00 an hour.

- 3. The online survey form filled out by Objectors did not provide the option of reporting the "number of hours worked," unlike the contractors' online survey form, which expressly solicited such information.
- 4. Objectors have written evidence that the rates prescribed in Paragraph 2, above, are supported by a plurality of the man-hours worked in Saline County during the relevant time period.
- 5. The Division, apparently ignoring the Objectors' submissions, erroneously established the following prevailing wage rate for the Carpenter (Building) occupational title in Saline County: a base hourly wage rate of \$34.61; a foreman hourly prevailing wage rate of \$0.00; an hourly health insurance fringe benefit contribution of \$8.07; an hourly retirement fringe benefit contribution of \$0.00; an hourly vacation fringe benefit contribution of \$1.08; an hourly apprenticeship training fringe benefit contribution of \$0.58; and other fringes of \$8.75 an hour. The Division's other findings are correct.
- 6. Pursuant to the new 2018 Prevailing Wage Methodology published by the Division, the Division's wage determination is based solely on man-hour submissions by contractors. This new methodology was not published, and Objectors were not aware of the new methodology, until after the deadline for submission of the Objectors' union survey. Accordingly, Objectors were unable to coordinate with the union's signatory contractors to submit relevant man-hours in a timely fashion.
- 7. In past years, the Division generally established the prevailing wage based on Wage Certification Forms submitted by labor unions. By arbitrarily changing the methodology this year without prior notice, the Division has unfairly prejudiced Objectors.

WHEREFORE, Objectors respectfully request that the Conciliation and Mediation Division consider favorably the Objection of Objectors and revise the prevailing wage rate in Saline County for the Carpenter (Building) occupational title, as described herein, to reflect the prevailing practices throughout the geographic jurisdiction in question, and for such other changes as are deemed appropriate. Should the Division fail or refuse to act accordingly based on this Objection alone, Objector hereby requests a hearing on the matter.
